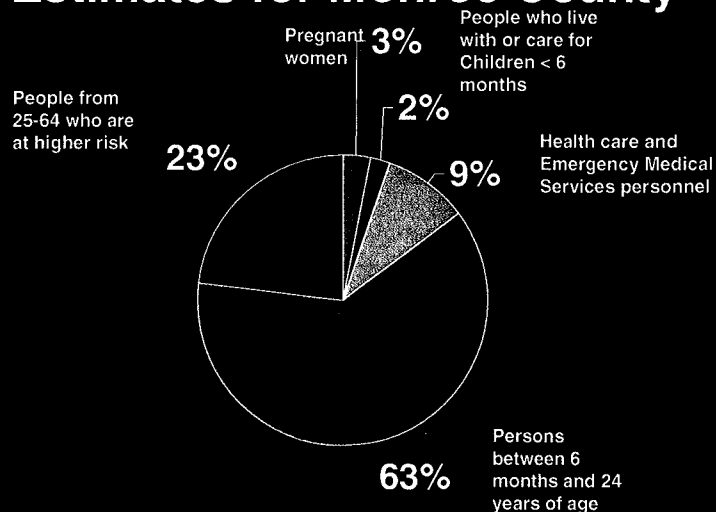
H1N1 Vaccine Target Groups "Phase 1"

- Pregnant women
- People who live with or care for children < 6 months old
- Health care and EMS personnel
- Persons 6 months - 24 years of age
- People from ages 25 - 64 with chronic health disorders

Mass Vaccination Clinic Details

- 1 4-7 clinics possible
 - Geographically dispersed across Monroe County
 - 2-3 day period
 - 12 hours a day
 - Multiple clinics simultaneously in initial stages
- 2 Volunteers needed for non-medical support
 - Maximize use of existing POD volunteer structure
 - 30 - 50 per shift
 - City / County employees?
- 3 Other support needed
 - Security (Law Enf?)
 - Logistical
 - Communications

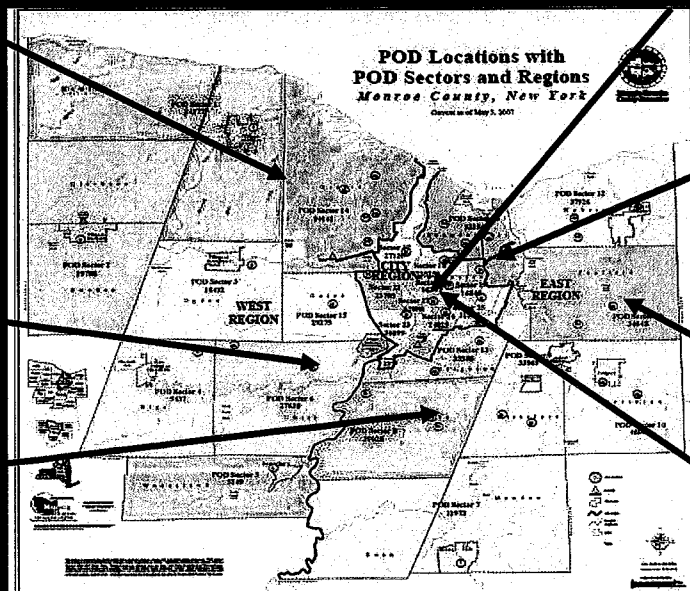
